Saiqa is a Child Health Specialist with the USAID supported Sustaining Health Outcomes through the Private Sector (SHOPS) Plus project at Abt Associates, based in Bethesda Maryland USA. She has over twelve years of experience in policy and advocacy, program management, gender integration, community mobilization, capacity building, public-private partnerships, and strategic planning, focused on resource-challenged settings for vulnerable populations such as women and girls.

Prior to Abt, Ms. Panjsheri led CARE USA's Learning Tours Program, and she also spent several years implementing reproductive and maternal health programs in twelve developing countries as part of the Mothers Matter Signature Program, brokered a global partnership between UNFPA and CARE, and

organized an internal task force on integrating reproductive health programs across the agency. Saiqa'a professional background also includes working in the Gender and Development unit at The World Bank on the launch of the Adolescent Girls Initiative and advancing health related and gender-sensitive programs at UNICEF and Population Action International (PAI).

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New Self leadership module

Jean Yves-Mercier (featured above) has been leading the Selfleadership module in UNIGE since 2007 within the Executive MBA program. Starting next academic year, this module is being offered to IOMBA students as well, as part of a comprehensive approach to career development.

The Self leadership module comprises a number of sessions where coaches guide students towards building a career action plan, position themselves within organizational needs and become further self aware.

This module kicks off the path to career development support, followed by Professional Skills Training with Deborah Küttemann (practical sessions where students explore job search strategies, go into the different application materials and interviewing skills), and wrapping up with the optional Mentoring Program offered by alumni.

A couple of alumni will have the opportunity to take the Self leadership module next academic year in order to advance their skills, develop their own career and become coaches for the 2017-2018 IOMBA cohort.
